

Fight Back Against Scams

CEL&P consumers need to be aware that scammers are targeting energy customers everywhere. They often call threatening to shut off power unless payment is made immediately. Scammers may also suggest that you have overpaid and ask for bank information to provide a credit. Never give out personal information to anyone who calls claiming to be from your utility!

Don't fall for these scams! Any possible disconnection would be preceded by written notice in the mail. CEL&P will never call demanding immediate payment over the phone. Have a Safe Pool Season

When you jump into the pool, you are ready for some refreshing fun. Someone getting hurt from electrical contact is probably one of the furthest things from your mind. Before you jump in, you need to take the necessary steps to make sure everything is safe and you are ready for any possible emergency so that you can concentrate on having fun!

Taking action before the pool season starts can avert a tragedy. Homeowners should make sure that the National Electric Code has been followed for wiring and that ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs) are properly installed on equipment in areas around pools, spas, and hot tubs.

It is recommended that you test your GFCIs on a monthly basis to make sure that they don't need to be replaced.

Other steps to take to ensure the swimming season is a safe one include using battery-powered appliances and electronics around the pool instead of connecting them to an extension cord. Pool owners should have an emergency plan posted in plain view in the pool area with instructions on how to assist someone who is suffering an electrical shock.
